
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Visiting the Nursery

The Nursery is located at the top of Wellwood Avenue. From the Holywood Road, turn into Connsbrook Avenue. Follow the road until coming to Wellwood Avenue.

The Curriculum

Children learn from the moment they are born and the Pre School Curriculum reflects and extends this learning process. Sandbrook Nursery delivers this curriculum in an appropriate, challenging and well resourced way. The individual needs of each child are identified and provided for.

There are 6 areas of learning in the Curriculum

- The Arts
- Language Development
- Early Mathematical Experiences
- Personal. Social and Emotional Development
- Physical Development and movement
- The World Around Us

Further information on Curriculum is contained in a separate booklet.

Children with Special Educational Needs will be carefully assessed according to the Special Needs Policy and appropriate provision made. The teacher will work closely with parents and external agencies.

Record Keeping/Assessment

The nursery makes and keeps records and assessments on all children. This helps us to celebrate success and identify specific needs a child may have. The nursery holds a number of parent teacher interviews and operates an informal "open door" policy, where a parent can chat about concerns, time permitting-

A Day in Sandbrook Nursery

The day begins promptly at 9 am and finishes at 1.30pm. We also offer a 'Breakfast Club' with early drop off from 8.30am. Children can be collected from 1.15pm, this allows you time to sit and play. The school follows a routine that works and the children respond to it very well.

- Morning- Registration and welcome Classes merge for indoor structured play and self service snack Classes prepare for outdoor play (Each child still has an option of indoor or outdoor play as one room will remain opened and supervised) Story room session
- Lunch- A two course lunch is served in each room. This is a very social event, where discussion and manners play an important part.
- Afternoon- Story room session Choice of indoor/ outdoor play

Uniform

We encourage all children to wear a uniform as it helps protect their own clothes from the materials they will be using in school and it also gives a sense of belonging and identity.

The uniform is made up of a red sweatshirt with school logo, a navy polo shirt and navy jogging bottoms. We encourage trousers and shoes that the child can handle independently. Uniform will be on sale in nursery. Shoes need to be well fitted and velcro strap for outdoor play eg flip flops and laces are not safe for climbing activities.

A complete change of clothes will be kept in school for your child on his/her coat peg. As the children engage in various physical play, it is not appropriate for jewellery to be worn to nursery. This includes hooped earrings and necklaces.

(All uniform orders are placed in June, ready for collection in August)

Snack and Dinner

Snack and dinner are served on the premises. Snack begins straight away and is self service.

Dinner is a two course meal served in the classrooms. The school follows a healthy eating policy at all times.

Dinners currently cost £2.50 a meal (this can be subject to change) and school fund costs £3.50 a week snack is included in this fee. This money is payable on a weekly or monthly basis. Anyone eligible for free school meals should apply via the Education Authority website https://www.eani.org.uk/financial-help/free-schoolmeals . Mrs Cooke will be happy to help if you have any questions.

School fund money will also cover other costs such as school excursions, resources, visitors, playdough ingredients etc. (Any outstanding bills will be referred to the Board of Governors and then to the Financial Control Department in the Education Authority for immediate payment)

Starting Nursery

At Sandbrook Nursery, it is very important to us that both parents and children feel happy and valued. We want your child to start nursery with as much ease as possible. To achieve this, please read the following guidance-

We operate a staggered intake that means that we will start children in small groups for various amounts of time. This varies from child to child. We treat each child individually and will respond to their needs. We are aware of parental work obligations etc but please bear with us- we want to ensure each child makes a solid start to their pre school year. Each child will be given a start date, please keep to that date.

Day One- Come to school 9.30, for one hour. Be prepared to stay in nursery as reassurance for your child. Finish at 10.30am

Day Two- Come to school at 9am, finish 10.30am. Be prepared to stay in nursery again, although most parents will not be required to. Day Three and onwards- Come to school at 9am, finish times and the need for an adult to stay will now start to vary, class teacher will advise.

Starting dinners will also be staggered; class teachers will distribute notes in September. Once your child starts staying for dinner, home time will be 1.30pm



Other Helpful Hints

Here are a few pieces of guidance which we hope will be of some use to you. Should you have any questions that we haven't quite answered or you feel you need more information, just ask!

- Don't feel you must keep every piece of art work your child makes- each child will be presented with a scrap book of their year in nursery in the month of June
- Try to discourage your child from bringing personal toys, comforters etc- we can't guarantee they won't be mislaid and they will not be able to be brought into the classroom.
- <u>Cars are not allowed</u> in the school car park at any time due to Health and Safety reasons- please inform everyone with responsibility of collecting your child
- The nursery has a long and detailed list of policies that are followed. These policies can be read at any time- ask a member of staff
- We work closely with our parents throughout the year to ensure excellent communication links. We would appreciate being informed of any information that may affect your child eg arrival of a new baby, changes in home life etc.
- Home time is 1.30pm, however you may come to nursery from 1.15pm. Should you wish to engage with your child in some play. Any other changes eg doctors' appointments need to be arranged with the teacher
- Persons under the age of sixteen years or under the influence of any substance will not be allowed to collect a child from nursery.

Sandbrook Nursery School Child Protection Statement

This school has a pastoral responsibility towards the children in its care to protect them from harm and a responsibility to develop and adhere to Child Protection Policies in its work with children.

Legal responsibilities place duties on the staff at this school to put Child Protection Policies and Procedures into place if abuse is suspected or if a disclosure is made to a member of staff.

Abuse may take a number of forms, including neglect, physical injury. emotional and sexual abuse. Some forms of abuse are also a criminal offence.

All members of staff have been made aware of the procedures to be used where there is cause for concern regarding child abuse or where a member of staff is accused of abuse.

The designated teacher for Child Protection in Sandbrook Nursery is Mrs L Cromie and she will make the necessary referrals to the Social Services and the Education Authority. If they are unavailable, Mrs Campbell or Mrs Gorman will take over the role as deputy designated teacher.


The prime consideration in every instance is the welfare and needs of the child concerned and any preliminary inquiries necessary will be made carefully and sensitively.

Parents who have concerns about a child's safety and welfare, should make these concerns known to the designated staff and/ or the Chairperson of the Board of Governors.

Information given to staff about possible child abuse cannot always be held in confidence. In the best interests of the child, this information may be shared with other professionals.

Child Protection is everyone's business and the welfare of al/ children is paramount.
